E. <u>Legislative Committee</u> – (P. Fantulin, Chairperson)

The following items were reported on:

-Currently there are 139 Bills in the legislature's committees that affect education. Approximately, 84 of these bills have some relevance to Midland Park. Of these, 7 had been primed for a final vote in the legislature before their reorganization took place. All of these have been reintroduced and returned to committee.

Also, returned to committee in both houses is the recess bill that Governor Christie vetoed. At this point, Governor Christie has a perfect record with zero vetoes overridden, but the legislature now has 52 votes in the 80 member lower house. They need to convince two Republicans in order to override a future veto, rather than the four they needed in the last legislative session. The Senate needs three Republican votes for an override. They have already achieved that last fall in a gun control bill.

The bill A2469/S1144 requires daily recess for children in grades K-5. Midland Park has a strong recess program, but the bill is still notable because it limits the disciplinary use of withholding recess to two days per week and it would not allow us to have children take enrichment in place of recess.

F. <u>Buildings & Grounds Committee</u> – (P. Triolo, Chairperson)

The front showcase has been completely finished – this is a donation from the class of 1964.

G. <u>Negotiations Committee</u> - (W. Sullivan, Chairperson)

We anticipate a meeting in early March and then we will have a meeting with the Association thereafter.

H. <u>Technology & Public Relations Committee</u> – (R. Formicola, Chairperson)
