 - School/Funding Reform Legislation In July 2018, Governor Murphy signed S-2 into Law, which goes into effect in for the 2019-2020 school year. The S-2 law made major changes to the States school funding formula. NJ has identified an allocation category, called Overfunded Act and some districts will experience reductions of overfunding through the 2024-2025 school year. Our district is not affected by this.
 - Pass the Trash mandates that districts review the employment history of job applicants to ascertain they have not had any past allegations of instances of child abuse of sexual misconduct involving students.
 - Mandatory Daily Recess Starting in 2019-2020 daily recess is required for at least 20 minutes for grades K-5, except on delayed openings or early dismissal days.
