### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT Dr. Marie Cirasella

 Dual enrollment programs allow secondary students to enroll in college courses and receive higher education credit prior to graduating high school. Successful dual enrollment programs provide academic, social, and financial benefits to students by increasing college readiness, improving the college participation rates of at-risk students, and reducing the cost of higher education.

We are pleased to report that MPHS students have the opportunity to participate in 39 classes that offer college credit. MPHS offers 19 Advanced Placement (AP) classes and 20 dual enrollment course offerings. Once the dual enrollment course is completed, a transcript is provided upon request from the higher education institution.

The popularity of the district's dual enrollment program has increased over the past three years as more partnerships with colleges have been established. The impressive number of dual enrollment course offerings for a school our size is truly significant and we are extremely proud of the multi-year effort that has resulted in such an amazing program, one that has benefitted many of our graduating seniors who leave MPHS having completed a semester of credits in higher education. Here is a list of the institutions we have partnered with: Seton Hall University, Bergen Community College, Rutgers University, Kean University and Ramapo College.

• We anticipate many of the challenges of COVID will be behind us in September and we will be reinstating monthly presentations at our live Board meetings, here is the tentative schedule:

September & February: MPHS October & March: Godwin School November & April: Highland School

December & May: Department of Athletics January & June: Department of Special Services Additional presentations will be given in accord with districtwide business and state mandate. We are looking forward to showcasing our amazing students, staff and administrators and are certain these presentations will widen the circle of information and communication for all.

- The Connecting with Coffee and Conversations forums with me will be reinstated and there will be at least two forums next year (schedule TBA). As in the past, any topic may be brought forward at a forum, each will have a defined focus, i.e., elementary, secondary, special education, athletics, facilities and business office. Various members of the administrative team will join me for these interactive experiences, which have been very well received in the past. We will encourage everyone to drop by to share thoughts, questions, concerns and messages of positivity.
- We have been notified that our district will receive another approximately \$770K in ESSER II grant funding. The requirements for spending this allocation are the same as in the prior grant with the application due in November. In consideration of the input from families and staff, which placed social-emotional learning and content area remediation and acceleration as priorities for spending, administrators and school-based teams have already begun planning and program development and we plan to share more information on grant specifics once approval is received.
