Presentation of the proposed 2015-2016 School Budget and Public Hearing.

Mr. Schiffer presented the proposed school budget for the 2015-2016 school year. He explained that the additional funds being added to the budget from Capital Reserve account are to renovate the maintenance garage storage area to create office space. This would be done in order to move district administration out of the high school which would open additional classroom space.

## **Board Member questions:**

Mr. Sullivan asked if state aid funding was flat for next year. Ms. Garvey replied yes.

Mr. Triolo asked if we are adding a computer lab. Dr. Cirasella answered the computer lab was already created by funds donated by the Education Foundation.

Mr. Formicola wanted to know if State Aid was cut, could we be forced to use the Capital Reserve funds for the general fund support after the budget is approved. Ms. Garvey answered no. Once the funds become part of the capital budget they cannot be reallocated.

Ms. Criscenzo asked what office staff would be relocated. Dr. Cirasella answered that it would be only district level administration.

#### Open to the Public

Ms. Kim Rupp asked where will the new kindergarten classrooms going to be located. Dr. Cirasella answered that there will be a Kindergarten Program held for the public and this is where specifics will be discussed.

Mr. David Gorman commented that he read the article regarding the Mechanical Upgrades at Highland School and their bid being below the estimated budget. He asked what happens with the extra funds.

Dr. Thomas replied that the remaining funds can be used for other referendum projects.

Ms. Pat Fantulin questioned what staff would be moving to the maintenance building. Dr. Cirasella replied it will be board/central office staff.

Ms. Fantulin had a question regarding adding new electives and asked how do you know what students are going to sign up. Dr. Thomas replied some are already registered for these items.

Minutes of the Public Meeting of April 28, 2015

Mr. David Gorman commented the 2% budget cap and the increase over for health care costs. He asked if the philosophy is to try to keep the increase as low as possible. Mr. Schiffer answered 90% of the budget is contractual and increases well beyond 2%. If you look at the past budget increases, the Board always accepted a tight budget and gave back funds to offset tax base. Taxes are also impacted by the County and the Town. Always try to keep lower than 2% if possible.

Ms. Fantulin commented that some things are not mentioned for example, New Jersey underfunded schools by billions over the years. Funding was lost years ago and shifted to the rise in the tax base creating mandates that cost more-now PARCC – and the district does not receive any additional dollars.

Included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve- Excess Costs & Other Capital Projects is \$600,000 for other capital project costs for renovations to the maintenance garage storage area in order to relocate administrative and support staff office space. This effort will result in the reclaiming of instructional/classroom space for student and staff use at Midland Park Junior Senior High School (MPHS). The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$600,000 which represents expenditures for renovation elements or projects that are in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the CCCS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the GENERAL FUND tax levy \$18,705,258 is approved to support Current General Expense and \$910,587 to support Debt Service, for the 2015-2016 school year budget. Included in the General Fund Tax Levy is a Health Care Cost Adjustment in the amount of \$136,319.
