Dr. Heebink commented that the Scholar Athlete award would now include a weighted GPA for honors and AP students and not just the Honor Roll as a decision for the award. The GPA would be 3.75 weighted.

Mr. Canellas asked if that would mean that a grade of C in an Honors program would allow a student to be awarded Student/Athlete.

Dr. Heebink explained the weighted GPA and agreed that a C in an honors program would count for the award.

Mr. Schiffer asked that all students receiving GPA's totaling 3.75 be awarded the Student/Athlete recognition.

Dr. Heebink agreed.

Mr. Venditti then further clarified that every student would get two looks.

Ms. Jane Bandstra, 64 Hill Street, asked how the grade in Math for this semester in the 10th and 11th grade would be handled since it will be pass/fail.

Mr. Schiffer and Dr. Heebink both noted that any P/F grade would be eliminated from the decision of GPA.

Ms. Criscenzo stated the P/F might actually hurt an Honor student who would get an A+ in that P/F class as the weighted average would create a much higher GPA.
